

Ever had your car break down on a lonely stretch of road, far from help or friends? Imagine being in that situation and then realizing the problem is something you can fix by yourself. You break out your tool kit and launch under the hood. An hour later you're on the road again with a good story to tell.

By intention, mission pilots end up far away from help and friends every day. If something goes wrong with the plane they need to break out the tool kit and make it right themselves. That's why every missionary trained at Moody Aviation and every pilot with MAF is a certified Aviation Maintenance Technician (AMT, or airplane mechanic). In our five-year training program students study Bible, missions, airplane maintenance, and flight so they are well-prepared for anything.

God keeps calling young people to serve Him in mission aviation and we thank Him that enrollment in the training program is growing. Not long ago classes of fifteen were the norm, but this spring there are thirty students beginning our maintenance training! With all the new students, the maintenance training staff needed some help and I (Gene) was asked to teach some classes for them this spring. It's been great fun getting to know students at the beginning of our program and starting them on the road to mission service.

Moody's maintenance training is housed in a grand old brick hangar built for the Army Air Corps before World War II. At 80 years old the building's solid as a rock and was recently refurbished for our use. In its early years it was used to train young people for war in defense of our nation. Now it's still being used to train young people, but this time for our King! The building stands as a great reminder for us that we are at war. As Paul wrote to Timothy: "Endure hardship with us like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No one serving as a soldier gets involved in civilian affairs—he wants to please his commanding officer" (2 Timothy 2:3-4, NIV). I don't know about you, but sometimes it's just too easy for me to slip into civilian affairs and forget to make use of every resource and opportunity to please our Commanding Officer, so this reminder is good.

If we back up in Paul's letter to verse 2, it expresses why MAF has us here at Moody: "And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable men who will also be qualified to teach others." Gospel-bearers must be trained both spiritually and technically if they are to be effective at fulfilling the commission God has given us. We are here to teach reliable young people who will then go teach others what they have been taught. Thanks for standing with us as good soldiers, committing both your prayers and resources for the training of these new recruits. We couldn't do this without you!
