
Summertime Expressions of Thanks

Here at 49° north the longest days of the year mean somewhat more than 16 hours of daylight are available for work and play—but not much sleep. And so it seems that God's appointed times and seasons keep rolling around, bringing with them the joy of the good work God has given us—as well as times of thanks.

One of the more joyful events of the season is the graduation of the latest class of new mission aviators. Among these, three are maintenance specialists (non-pilots who are the lead mechanics in the shop), two others are sticking around for the summer to take the Flight Instructor course with me (Gene—to earn the credential to be teachers themselves), and two are moving toward mission service as soon as possible. The rest have still have some requirements to finish up for their degree.

Recently I had opportunity to work with a visiting pilot named Stefan. He had trained at a variety of places (other than Moody) and is eager to serve in missions, but felt that his piecemeal instruction had left him with a lack of the polish and consistency he needs to be safe and effective. He visited Moody for a couple of weeks while I worked with him toward his goals. As we finished he exclaimed, "Please tell your people thank you for me. I'm amazed that I can come here and take this much of your time and receive such quality training for such a low cost. It's only possible because of the people who are part of your team. Please thank them!" And so, *thank you*. I think he said it well for all our students, and ultimately, those *they* will serve at the ends of the earth.





Thanks from Nepal News of the devastation in Nepal still shocks us after two major earthquakes and hundreds of aftershocks have taken over 8,000 lives. Working together with a Nepalese company and two helicopters, MAF has launched a response operation. Twenty-four aid organizations are using the service, and the MAF team is hard at work on these lifesaving flights—bringing help, hope and healing to the many remote villages cut off from food, shelter and medical help.

Working in one of the hardest hit areas, David Couzens of Tearfund says: "We're using MAF to get there because, to be honest, there would be no other way of getting there." Jerry Clewett of United Mission to Nepal says: "Without those helicopters, we could not reach those villages... those villages would have nothing as far as we're aware, so these can be
