Good News A few weeks ago we received our "Notice of Favorable Determination" from the US Citizen and Immigration Services. This means we are approved by the US government to adopt Carmelle and Néhémie from Haiti, and our file has been forwarded to the embassy in Port-au-Prince. Now we are finishing our paperwork for the Haitian government. Please pray for us as we process these documents, that they will be correct and acceptable to the various offices in Haiti, and for all we will need to complete the adoption.
