Pierce County Prayer Breakfast May 1, 2015

"Our hands are raised to you, the Native way of showing respect and gratefulness, for partnering with us to bring a growing unity to the Body of Christ."

Many of you have prayed for and some have given towards this unique, non-denominational outreach that has happened every May for the last 37 years. For the first time in their history the committee decided to have a Native American speaker, Hattie Kauffman, come and share her story of how she came to be a follower of Jesus. She is from the Nez Perce tribe, raised on the streets of Seattle, and was the first Native American on a national news broadcast. She has worked for both ABC and CBS.

I was asked to be involved in the planning because of my connections in the Native community. I had read Hattie's book, "Falling into Place," but had never met her or heard her speak. Our local pastor is also from the Nez Perce tribe and he introduced Hattie at the breakfast with a hymn in their tribal language. Connie McCloud, the spiritual leader of the Puyallup tribe, gave a "Welcome to the Land" greeting.

We sent invitations to the tribal councils of the six closest tribes to come and join us at the breakfast. We would cover the cost of the breakfast in appreciation for their attendance. I contacted most of my Native friends from our previous 30 years of ministry. Then I 'cried out' to you, our prayer and financial supporters, to pray and donate money to pay for the tables so that we could offer this gift to the local Native people. There was an outpouring of love gifts from you that allowed us to host 13 tables (10 people at each table). It turned out to be the largest turnout in the history of the Prayer Breakfast. There were 1500 people there and, of those, at least 130 were Native.



There is now a whole new awareness of and appreciation for the local Native population in our Tacoma area. They have asked Pastor Porter and me to continue to have a part in making this event 'Native friendly.' Our hands are raised to you, the Native way of showing respect and gratefulness, for partnering with us to bring a growing unity to the Body of Christ.
